Maroon Football Continues Streak

On October 2, the Ridgewood High School Football Team continued their winning streak by defeating Kennedy High School 35-0. This win marks the sixty-third shutout for Coach Chuck Johnson, and the second straight shut-out for the Maroons this season.

Highlights included three defensive turnovers, including a fourth and goal stop by the RHS defense. Senior, Mitch Campbell, completed five passes for a total of 141 yards and a touchdown. Senior quarterback, Matthew Donovan, went 8-for-12, and completed two touchdown passes with no interceptions. The entire Maroon team performed exceptionally.

The next football game for the Ridgewood team will be at Clifton High School on October 10, starting at 7:30.


