Learning Commons is a great space and constantly filled. Being used by classes. Student government holding Thanksgiving Food Drive for Social Service Association of Ridgewood. Hoping that each student will donate at least one can of food. Chromebooks are working well. More teachers and students are incorporating Google classroom and Google docs.

### **Principal's Report - Tom Gorman**

Learning Commons has been open for 2 weeks. Still a lot of punch list items. 99% complete. 200 students can use Learning Commons. Open from 7:15 am – 4:15 pm.

One third of Chromebooks are being used at one time. Teachers and students trying to find balance.

Theater - *Light up the Sky* just completed. *A Christmas Carol* will be in production in December. *Shrek the Musical* will be produced this spring.

RHS athletics had great season. Almost every team made it to the states and progressed at various levels. Cross Country both boys and girls have won state sectionals for 22 consecutive years.

First quarter ended. Second quarter started on Monday.

## **Assistant Principal Report - Basil Pizzuto**

Policing policy of single period absences. Some students may be missing a class in order to miss taking a test. If going to a doctor's appointment, student should bring in a doctor's note. Parents should let GA know earlier when student will be missing a class. RHS has wonderful daily attendance but has to report data to state by period. A reminder about single period absence policy will be sent to parents and students

Discussed possibility of hiring Dr. Michael Fowlin, a psychologist, dramatic theater actor and poet, to address RHS students. Hoping on financial assistance from RHS HSA to pay for speaker. Dr. Fowlin met with peer counselors this past summer and they were quite impressed with him. Peer Counselors think it would be beneficial for Dr. Fowlin to speak with entire school. Besides Thanksgiving Food Drive for SSA, RHS also buys gifts for SSA families. Trying to get our students more involved.

#### **Assistant Principal Report - Jeff Nyhuis**

Financial aid meeting is Thursday, November 20. Speaker discusses how to complete FASA form. College application update - RHS has processed 2050 transcripts or an average of 4.4 per student. 700 teacher recommendations have been completed. 312 seniors are applying to a 4-year college. 100 seniors have applied Early Decision with 25 to Ivy League schools. Seniors have applied Early Action to 244 schools.

### **Faculty Report - Catherine Venturini**

Learning Commons allows for studious relaxation. It's very different from the old library. Students should work on dossier outlining wonderful things you have done which helps when teachers write recommendations

This year, there's been a lot of sharing between faculty members. There's a lot of energy and it's an exciting time to teach.

Scholarship Strategies – Finding and Winning the Money You Need

There are over 150,000 scholarships nationwide. Scholarships are not only available for academics and athletics. Scholarships are available for every grade level. For example, Google offers a scholarship starting in kindergarten.

There is no cap in scholarship money.

Your student should set a number of scholarships he/she will apply for. It's a numbers game. Apply for different scholarships. Dig out every essay and poem that you have written in the past

on which you had received a B or higher. College essays can also be used to apply for scholarships.

Create a search engine list. Go to Barnes & Noble with this list. Look through scholarship books in College Search section. Write down information for scholarships using the index.

Find scholarships that take work to complete because less students apply for these scholarships. Start local when applying for scholarships followed by state and lastly national.

December 3 – RHS students are meeting with counselors to discuss local scholarships. List is available on Naviance.

Make a list of every family member and have your child call to let family members know that he/she is looking for scholarships.

## **Committee Reports:**

#### **Jamboree**

Laurie Jordan spoke about how Jamboree gives over \$100,000 a year in scholarship funds to RHS students. Some scholarships are based on need. Parents do not need to participate in Jamboree in order for students to apply for scholarship.

#### **Smart Balance**

Lori Weil reported that Smart Balance Initiative was created to address and try to mitigate the stress felt by our high schoolers.

Kids struggle with a tremendous amount of stress and pressure, have lots of homework and very little free time, struggle to balance extracurricular activities with schoolwork and don't have enough time for sleep or family time

Anne Robinson, who is a parent and a pediatrician, has worked with the district and RHS administrators for many years trying to educate our community about the health requirements of our students and to create policies that will benefit the entire school community. Some of the policies include homework free breaks, sleep-in or enrichment Wednesdays and most recently, the summer black out period and a 3-hr time limit on after school activities Committee has been trying to move forward with a 2-week summer black out for all sports and activities. An overwhelming number of families are asking for 2 weeks, especially families with 2 sets of parents. Given that our kids lose their February break and gain a week in the summer, parents were hoping for the 2 weeks

Disappointed that one of the weeks given this summer is final exam week – don't really consider that "free" or "family" time.

Many parents are concerned about the wishy-washy policy surrounding homework free breaks. April break should be homework free, especially as kids no longer have February break. A new initiative we have been discussing that came from the students, is shortening class time

and adding minutes onto period 9 at the end of the day. Students are frustrated they can't get the extra help they need in 15 minutes, or feel rushed to get to a practice, and it would be great to extend period 9

Principal's Advisory Group has asked for more time in period 9. Perhaps shorten class periods from 61 minutes to 59 minutes in order to make period 9 longer. When polled, the majority of teachers favored this idea. Can period 9 rotate with the schedule?

Discussed issue with student athletes feeling stressed that they had to be ready and on the field prior to the official start of 3:30 pm practice.

There's a conflict with academics and sports. Students who attend DECA and AMSTUD trips are often penalized for missing practice. Games should not be scheduled same days as SAT and ACT testing dates.

Discussed that athletes who miss PE due to a meet or game have to make up the run even though they are running in their game.

If RHS had 2-week summer black out for all sports, we could lead the way for other districts!
